B. Learning Management System (LMS) among University Students: Does It Work?

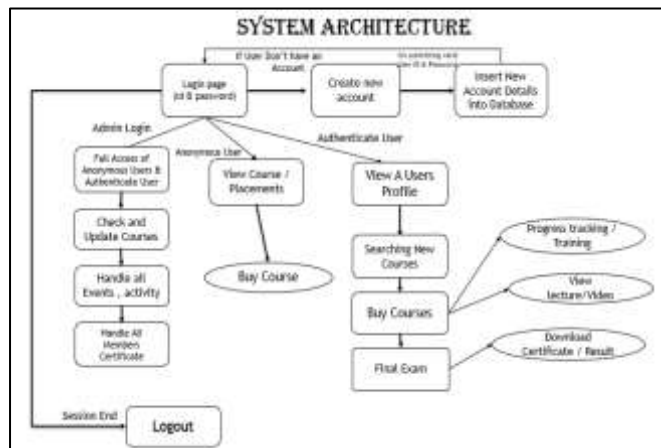
